What does this mean for you?

- Recycling will be town-wide, every other WEDNESDAY. Plastic bottles/jugs, paper, cartons/cardboard, and metal/aluminum cans ONLY.
- If you put trash or incorrect items into the recycling bin two pickups in a row, we will **confiscate** the bin. We will have a one month grace period.

YOUTH SHINE AT EDENTON'S FIRST PUBLIC SERVICE CAMP

A small group of seventh to ninth graders have spent the last six weeks in what has been called the Town of Edenton's first ever "Public Service Camp." The camp -- masterminded by Town Manager Corey Gooden -- aims to expose Chowan County youth to local careers right here at home, particularly in the public sector.

"We've seen a need here at home for jobs to be filled, not just in the private sector, but here in the public sector as well," Gooden says. "We want kids to know there are options that don't involve having to leave home or pursue a college degree." From learning how to change a car's oil at Public Works and racing to put on equipment and gear at the Fire Department, to learning to intubate at EMS and practicing economic development with the Chamber of Commerce, the kids have done it all!

Since June, our students have visited the Fire Department, Police Department, Public Works, Electric Department, Chowan County Extension, Chowan EMS, Town Hall, the Barker House, the Sheriff's Office and 911 Center, and the Historic Edenton Visitor Center. We thank our departments, local partners and Ms. Gwen Brown for helping to make this happen, and we hope for an even better camp next year!
