#### **HARBOR TOWNS** RECEIVES \$10M

The Harbor Towns Ferry Project has just received \$10 million in funding from the N.C. General Assembly. Edenton will receive \$2 million from that sum to improve waterfront infrastructure, harbor hospitality, and town facilities. With boat inspections nearly complete, we are hoping for a launch come springtime.

### **SOCIAL DISTRICT** LAUNCHES DOWNTOWN

After a year of preparation, Edenton leaders voted this summer to launch a social district in downtown. Taking after nearly 40 other towns and cities across North Carolina, both town staff and Destination Downtown Edenton hope to see a big push towards downtown revitalization with the recent district launch in September.

"We have worked tirelessly to bring this social district to fruition," said Town Manager Corey Gooden. "Working alongside DDE, staff members, and town council to launch this bold initiative has been rewarding. We hope to see it pay off by attracting younger audiences, increasing business and foot traffic, and welcoming new investments in our downtown to take advantage of the opportunity."

What is a social district? Social districts are defined areas of towns and cities where alcohol can be consumed openly on sidewalks, crosswalks and inside participating businesses. Look for green, yellow, and red stickers downtown! Green = sale of alcohol. Yellow = alcohol is welcome but not sold. Red = alcohol is not welcome inside. Labeled cups purchased at businesses must be used. The district is for beer and wine only. Hours are 5 PM-9 PM Thursday and Friday, and 11 AM to 9 PM on Saturday and Sunday.
